ORDER FOR ACCESS TO INVENTORIED ITEMS

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. The parties shall be provided access on site to the following inventoried items located at the facilities of the Chicago Police Department’s Evidence and Recovery Property Section (ERPS), for purposes of observation, photographing, and non-destructive examination, for use in this litigation:

No testing or handling of any kind shall be performed without a further order of the Court, with the exception of the handling of the above listed evidence by a Chicago Police Department employee at

ERPS for the purposes of the parties photographing the evidence.

2. Before any access to inventoried items is granted pursuant to this order, reasonable notice must be given to opposing counsel, and opposing counsel shall have the right to be present during such visit, including within sight of any and all examinations, unless such presence is waived by said counsel.

3. The parties shall not contest, object or raise any issue as to the chain of custody or the foundation for the inventoried items listed in paragraph one, above, as they relate to the entry of such inventories into evidence or their use as exhibits in the trial of this case due to the undertaking of any examination or photographing of such item in this litigation pursuant to this order. The parties reserve the right to make any and all other evidentiary objections to such items in regard to them being admitted into evidence or used as an exhibit at trial.
