NOTIFICATION OF DOCKET ENTRY

This docket entry was made by the Clerk on Thursday, June 13, 2024:

MINUTE entry before the Honorable Franklin U. Valderrama: For the reasons stated in the motion, the Court grants Defendant Officers' unopposed motion for leave to file an oversized motion to bar certain opinions of Plaintiffs' proposed expert Jon M. Shane [312], and their motion to bar Jon M. Shane may consist of 17 pages. The Court has also reviewed Defendants' amended unopposed motion for leave to file under seal their motion to bar certain opinions of Jon M. Shane, as well as exhibits, under seal [311]. The Court grants in part and denies in part the motion [311]. The Court grants Defendants leave to file Dr. Shane's report and his deposition, Exhibits A and D, fully under seal. However, as the Court stated on 6/12/2024 [310], based on its review of Defendants' sealed motion [304], there are at least some portions of the motion that do not appear to contain sensitive information and can be filed publicly on the docket. As a note, although Defendants' amended motion for leave to file under seal states that "Plaintiffs have sought the same relief for their motions and exhibits related to their Daubert motion related to the City's expert Michael Brown," Plaintiffs filed a redacted version of their motion [300] on the public docket (although Plaintiffs did request that, and the Court allowed, the exhibits to their motion to remain fully under seal). Accordingly, the Court directs Defendants to file a public redacted version of their motion to bar Dr. Shane's opinion on the public docket on or before 6/17/2024. The exhibits to the motion to bar may remain fully under seal. Mailed notice. (jcm)
