This docket entry was made by the Clerk on Monday, October 21, 2024:

MINUTE entry before the Honorable LaShonda A. Hunt: Defendant Kallatt Mohammed's Motion for Leave to File Amended Answer to Plaintiff's Complaint [162] is granted. Having considered the arguments made in the parties' briefs and at the hearing on 7/31/24, the Court finds that the request appears to have been presented with enough time before dispositive motions and trial to avoid any undue prejudice to Plaintiff. Defendant Mohammed must file his Amended Answer separately on the docket by 10/22/24. This ruling does not affect the admissibility of any evidence relating to Defendant Mohammed's prior invocation of the Fifth Amendment, which is an issue that may be appropriate to raise at a later stage in the case. The 11/1/24 deadline to file a joint status report [161] is reset to 11/5/24. Parties are to (1) confirm that all expert discovery is completed; (2) confirm that all previously-discussed fact discovery [172] is completed; (3) state if any additional discovery is necessary because of this ruling and if so, when that is scheduled to be completed; and (4) apprise the Court of any other pertinent information. The final pretrial conference set for 11/5/24 is stricken and will be reset after the Court reviews the joint status report. Emailed notice. (cdh,)
