And how long do you wait?</p> <p>6 A. Well, it could be months.</p> <p>7 Q. Okay. What do you do with the 8 detainee's clothing for the detainee who has not 9 signed the form?</p> <p>10 A. That's -- that's part of what we keep. 11 We just hang onto it.</p> <p>12 Q. And what happens after that four or 13 five-month period has elapsed and no one has 14 come to pick up the detainee's property?</p> <p>15 A. I still hang onto it. There's -- we -- 16 we hang onto it, basically.</p> <p>17 Q. Is there ever a time when that property 18 starts getting -- is destroyed?</p> <p>19 A. After some time, yes.</p> <p>20 Q. Are you involved with keeping -- with 21 any record-keeping of what property is 22 destroyed?</p> <p>23 A. If by -- paperwork given to the 24 warehouse, yes.</p>	<p>1 Q. Do you know who prepared it?</p> <p>2 A. This, no. No, sir. I know it -- it's 3 prepared, I guess, by people at the County. Who 4 exactly, I don't know.</p> <p>5 Q. Okay. Does the -- when you get the 6 forms after the detainee is shipped, do you also 7 get the property?</p> <p>8 A. No, not at that time, no.</p> <p>9 Q. Okay. Where is the property when the 10 detainee is shipped?</p> <p>11 A. It's on our inventory belts.</p> <p>12 Q. Could you -- what is the inventory 13 belt?</p> <p>14 A. No, if the property came down to us, 20 it's placed on a hook.</p> <p>21 Q. Is there enough room on the inventory 22 hook to hold all the prisoner property?</p> <p>23 A. Okay. Can you rephrase the question?</p> <p>24 Q. All right. Is there enough room on the</p>

8 A. Yes, none of that is shipped with the
 9 detainee.

10 Q. And has that been -- was that the
 11 practice before June of 2019?

12 A. Yes.

13 Q. Has that been the practice since at
 14 least 2015?

15 A. Yes.

16 Q. When did you start working with
 17 prisoner property?

18 A. I believe it -- well, when I started my
 19 employment there, October 1994.

20 Q. Did you volunteer to work in property,
 21 or were you --

22 A. No, no, that happens at the tier level.

23 Q. Okay. When did you stop working with
 24 prisoner property at the tier level?

1 this form is?

2 A. This form here indicates a -- a gurney
 3 is just a -- it's a big compartment with wheels,
 4 and we store detainee property there. In this
 5 case, that is the property that would be going
 6 to the warehouse at 45 days or donated property.

7 What you see -- gurney 59, that's how
 8 we labeled that particular gurney, and it had 96
 9 bags in it.

10 Q. And before that black rectangle was
 11 placed on the form, what information was on
 12 page one of -- was on page -- on that page?

13 A. Well, it would have been gurney
 14 number 60. By the size of that, maybe 61, 62.

15 Q. And did you prepare this form back in
 16 January of 2018?

17 A. Yes.

18 Q. And let's look at page two, which is
 19 marked Sheriff 0934. There's a signature. Is
 20 that your signature?

21 A. No, that would be Officer Mayo.

22 Q. And what information was on the form
 23 before the black rectangles were inserted there?

24 A. Other detainees' names and their IDs,

 2 know how -- how the process works? How I did
 3 it? Is that what you're asking?

4 Q. No, I want to know how long you've --
 5 how long has it been since you've been on the
 6 tier working with prisoner property?

7 A. Oh, I have not been on a tier since
 8 I -- 2007.

9 Q. Okay. Let me ask you to look at what
 10 has been -- it looks -- titled as Exhibit 4.

11 I think your counsel could hand that to
 12 you.

13 MR. DOMBROWSKI: Ken, I don't have numbers on
 14 it. Which --

15 MR. FLAXMAN: Just the file number. You
 16 don't have that either?

17 Exhibit 4 is the inmate shipment
 18 property memorandum dated -- Sheriff 933.

19 MR. DOMBROWSKI: 933? Okay.

20 MR. FLAXMAN: Right.

21 THE WITNESS: Okay. I have that in front of
 22 me.

23 BY MR. FLAXMAN:

24 Q. Could you tell us what this -- what

1 ID numbers. Book and ID numbers.

2 Q. And did the unclaimed property that was
 3 being -- that's referred to in this form, was
 4 that -- does that include clothing, or was that
 5 limited to -- well, did that include clothing?

6 A. Yes.

7 Q. Now, in the original form we had, the
 8 Exhibit 6, the current form, it talks about
 9 donating clothing?

10 A. The donation part?

11 Q. Right. What -- well, what happens with
 12 donated clothing?

 16 that made available to inmates who don't have
 17 clothing?

18 A. Okay. In that case, if it's a donated
 19 bag, we -- from that bag, we would use pants or
 20 shirts for detainees who have none upon their
 21 discharge, and jackets, for inclement weather.

22 Q. And is anything done with the compliant
 23 property that had been placed in the sealed bag
 24 by the arresting agency when the detainee says

<p>1 donate it?</p> <p>2 A. That, too, gets sent to the warehouse.</p> <p>3 It's all in one bag. The little bag, the big</p> <p>4 bag.</p> <p>5 Q. Okay. Do you know if the sealed bag</p> <p>6 that arrives with the inmate or the detainee</p> <p>7 from the arresting agency is ever unsealed</p> <p>8 before the prisoner leaves the jail?</p> <p>9 A. Yes.</p> <p>10 Q. When is it unsealed?</p> <p>11 A. There's a compartment in that bag</p> <p>12 that's set aside for currency. Well, let me show you which is a</p> <p>22 document -- or let me ask your counsel to show</p> <p>23 you a document that's a screenshot which has</p> <p>24 been identified as Exhibit 5. It's a landscape.</p>	<p>1 to -- there's a highlighted line sent to</p> <p>2 warehouse May 5 though 26. Do you see that?</p> <p>3 A. Yes.</p> <p>4 Q. When you looked at it, were you able to</p> <p>5 click on that line and bring up the document</p> <p>6 that's referred to by the file name?</p> <p>7 A. Yes.</p> <p>8 Q. What is CCOMS an abbreviation for?</p> <p>6 A. Let's see. Cook County Office 7 Management System. It's a management system 8 where we manage the detainee's whereabouts, 9 property, movement.</p> <p>10 Q. And how long have you been using that 11 system at the jail?</p> <p>12 A. Since its inception a few years back.</p> <p>13 Q. Is any effort made to remove plain 14 wedding bands from compliant property when the 15 prisoner is being shipped to IDOC and the 16 wedding band is still in the property bag?</p> <p>17 A. If we are made aware that there's a 18 wedding band upon shipment, we -- we will remove 19 that and give that to the detainee.</p> <p>20 Q. If there is a government issued 21 identification in this property bag that the 22 prisoner arrived with -- at the jail with, is 23 any effort made to remove that government issued 24 ID and send it to IDOC with the prisoner?</p>	<p>1 shipment donation/designator form? Is that on 2 the day of shipment?</p> <p>3 A. No. The best I can answer that is when 4 I worked the tier. And upon our notification 5 that the detainee is being shipped, we would be 6 given these forms, and we would have the 7 detainee fill out their part.</p> <p>8 Q. When you worked on the tier, were you 9 notified in the early morning hours of the day 10 of shipment that the particular detainee was 11 being shipped?</p> <p>12 A. Yes.</p> <p>13 Q. And early morning hours is like 3:00, 14 4:00 a.m.?</p> <p>15 A. Yes.</p> <p>16 Q. What shift did you work when you worked 17 on the tier?</p> <p>18 A. The night shift, 11:00 to 7:00 a.m.</p> <p>19 Q. And what shift do you work now?</p> <p>20 A. 6:00 to 2:00.</p> <p>21 Q. That's ... 22 I need to check one thing, and then 23 we're just about done.</p> <p>24 Oh, let me ask you to look at compliant</p>
<p>1 A. No, we do not give identifications to 2 the detainees upon their shipment.</p> <p>3 Q. Is there anything else other than 4 wedding bands that is -- can be removed from the 5 sealed property bag and sent along with the 6 prisoner to IDOC?</p> <p>7 A. If we're made aware of prescription 8 eyeglasses.</p> <p>9 Q. Anything else?</p> <p>10 A. No.</p> <p>11 Q. And how would you be made aware of 12 prescription eyeglasses?</p> <p>13 A. The detainee himself would let us know.</p> <p>14 Q. Is there a form for that?</p> <p>15 A. No, there's no form. We just indicate 16 that in the jail management system, referred to 17 as CCOMS, that a pair of eyeglass -- 18 prescription eyeglasses were removed.</p> <p>19 Q. Are prisoners notified in advance of 20 when their shipment date will be to IDOC?</p> <p>21 A. I don't know that.</p> <p>22 Q. That's fine.</p> <p>23 When is the prisoner asked to sign that 24 form?
