ANSWER: Yes. Being wrongfully imprisoned caused me stress and anxiety because I missed out on being with my loved ones, working and having a career, getting an education, and living a normal life. I have painful recurring memories of being arrested, prosecuted, and imprisoned because I was framed by Watts and his gang. I often have bad dreams and trouble sleeping and concentrating. I also become easily irritated and angered by minor things.
