JOINT STATUS REPORT

Pursuant to the Court’s July 31, 2025, minute order (Dkt. 245), Plaintiffs International Brotherhood of Teamsters Local No. 710 Pension Fund and Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (together, “Plaintiffs”) and Defendants Robert B. Ford, Robert J. Alpern, Roxanne S. Austin, Claire Babineaux-Fontenot, Sally E. Blount, Paola Gonzalez, Michelle A. Kumbier, Edward M. Liddy, Darren W. McDew, Nancy McKinstry, Phebe N. Novakovic, William A. Osborn, Michael F. Roman, Daniel J. Starks, John G. Stratton, Glenn F. Tilton, Miles D. White, Christopher J. Calamari, and Robert E. Funck (collectively, “Defendants”) and Nominal Defendant, Abbott Laboratories (collectively with Plaintiffs and Defendants, the “Parties”), hereby submit the following joint status report with an update on mediation efforts in advance of the August 6, 2025 status conference.

On May 21, 2025, after a hearing, the Court granted the Parties’ Joint Motion to Stay All Pending Deadlines until August 19, 2025, while the Parties pursued mediation. (Dkt. 241) In connection with mediation efforts, the Parties engaged two nationally recognized mediators, Judge Daniel Weinstein and Jed Melnick, to facilitate discussions. In advance of a formal mediation session, Plaintiffs and Defendants held multiple video conferences to discuss issues relevant to the mediation, including discussions relating to the mediation process and the information required to make a mediation productive. Among other things, before the mediation, Plaintiffs and Defendants

shared mediation statements outlining their positions in detail. These efforts culminated in an in-person mediation including all Parties and the mediators on July 29, 2025. The mediation negotiations were vigorous. At the conclusion of the in-person mediation session, the Parties scheduled a second remote mediation session for today, August 4, 2025. The Parties held that videoconference as scheduled and made further progress.

Judge Weinstein and Mr. Melnick have been involved in every step of the mediation process and have authorized the Parties to represent the mediators' view that negotiations thus far have been productive and in good faith. They also are available to speak with the Court, if requested and with permission of all counsel.

The Parties intend to continue mediation efforts and believe a 45-day extension of the stay of case will provide sufficient time for the parties to continue engaging in a productive exchange, as well as conserve resources. Accordingly, the Parties respectfully request that the Court extend its stay of all proceedings for 45 days, until October 3, 2025, while the Parties continue their discussions.
