 11 INTERVIEWER: Alright, here we go. Today we have
 12 Jacqueline Loca D Montanez, a former member of Chicago's Maniac
 13 Latin Disciples who at the age of 15 killed two Latin Kings;
 14 became the only female to be sentenced to life in prison as a
 15 juvenile.
 16 She's now out after doing 31 years. Welcome to Vlad TV.
 17 MS. MONTANEZ: Thank you.
 18 INTERVIEWER: Well, you have a very interesting story.
 19 So, you were born in 1976, and grew up in Chicago. What part
 20 of Chicago did you actually grow up in?
 21 A: Humboldt Park, westside of Chicago, Northwest.
 22 Q: What nationality are you?
 23 A: Puerto Rican.
 24 Q: Okay. And what was Chicago like during that time?
 25 A: I mean, it was rough. You live in poverty, you live
 26 in the streets; you're surrounded by gangs, drugs.
 27 Q: Okay, now your mother had a stepfather, where

1 A: No. it was just - it was a hush, hush thing. I
 2 think people started to notice it, but I think the beatings
 3 overrided it, so they were too busy watching the beatings.
 4 Q: How does a 7 year old little girl up to age 12,
 5 really deal with something as horrific as that?
 6 A: He was feeding me drugs.
 7 Q: Really. Okay, what kind of drugs at that point?
 8 A: Marijuana, cocaine.
 9 Q: Okay, and then at age 10, you were actually
 10 hospitalized for a drug overdose.
 11 A: Yeah.
 12 Q: So, was that sort of related to those two
 13 situations?
 14 A: Yeah.
 15 Q: Okay, okay what did you overdose on?
 16 A: Cocaine.
 17 Q: Okay -
 18 A: And it had some phenobarbital, some of my mother's
 19 seizure meds. So, we was popping pills.
 20 Q: Okay, I mean when a hospital brings in a 10 year old
 21 who is overdosing on cocaine, I mean, usually, at least Child
 22 Protective Services should be triggered and so forth, right?
 23 A: They was. But everyone was scared of my stepfather.
 24 Don't nobody fuck with my stepfather.
 25 Q: Okay, so even CPS was scared of your stepdad?
 26 A: Yeah.
 27 Q: Okay. Well, you said by age 12, your mom actually

1 exactly was your real father during this time.
 2 A: My mother had a husband; yeah I did have a
 3 stepfather. My real father was living his own life.
 4 Q: Did you guys have a relationship at all?
 5 A: We'd see each other like maybe once a month or
 6 something like that.
 7 Q: Okay, so you maintained a relationship with him.
 8 A: Yeah.
 9 Q: And you had two brothers and two sisters?
 10 A: Yeah.
 11 Q: And your stepfather was actually a high-ranking
 12 member of the Latin Kings?
 13 A: Yes, he was.
 14 Q: Tell me a little bit about him.
 15 A: Well, he was actually next to one of the leaders of
 16 Beach and Spaulding, a Latin Kings territory; and he ran that
 17 set, and he ran the drugs ring; he was just high up there, he
 18 was high up there.
 19 Q: And then in 1984, at age 7, something terrible
 20 started to happen to you at home.
 21 A: Yeah, I started getting raped.
 22 Q: Did your mother know about it at all?
 23 A: No. Not in the beginning.
 24 Q: Did she start to learn later on?
 25 A: She learned when I turned like 12 years old.
 26 Q: From age 7 to age 12, you were being molested by
 27 your stepfather. And did your siblings know?

1 found out about the rape.
 2 A: Yeah, she then gave me up to DCFS.
 3 Q: Which is what?
 4 A: Children and Family Services.
 5 Q: So, you were put in foster care?
 6 A: Yes.
 7 Q: Why did your mom give you up when you're the one
 8 that's the victim?
 9 A: I guess for support, you know. She was scared; I
 10 mean, he used to beat my mom as well. I guess she was in fear
 11 of her life leaving him.
 12 Q: Okay, what was that situation like when you left the
 13 house?
 14 A: I went to a group home; ran away, and that's when I
 15 joined the Maniac Latin Disciples.
 16 Q: Okay, so how did you actually join? Were you jumped
 17 in?
 18 A: Yeah. I was beaten.
 19 Q: How long does it last because I hear different
 20 stories about this type of thing.
 21 A: Well actually, I was beaten; my violation actually
 22 took - they gave me like a three minute head-to-toe. You have
 23 to choose - like I was allowed to choose back in the day, you
 24 was allowed to choose like either a cover-up would be more time,
 25 if you're covering up your face, or if you're not covering up
 26 your face, it would be less. So, I took the no coverup.
 27 Q: So, you got beat in the face a bunch of times.



1 Okay, and then after all that was done, now you're a Maniac
 2 Latin Disciple?
 3 A: Yeah.
 4 Q: The Maniac Latin Disciples, they're their own gang,
 5 but is there some similarities to the Gangster Disciples?
 6 A: Just the pitchfork, I mean, they folks; we just by
 7 ourselves.
 8 Q: So, now you're a gang member, and at the time the
 9 Maniac Latin Disciples, did they have beef with other gangs in
 10 Chicago.
 11 A: The Latin Kings; our number one enemy was the Latin
 12 Kings.
 13 Q: What was the history of that beef?
 14 A: Actually, that actually went way back before my
 15 time, so I can't even comment on that. That shit there was
 16 before I even became a Maniac.
 17 Q: Okay, but now you're a gang member, you have adopt
 18 all these beefs that you don't even really know why the beefs
 19 are there.
 20 A: I mean, [indiscernible] with the Kings no way, so I
 21 was okay with beefing with them.
 22 Q: Your stepdad was a Latin King?
 23 A: That's why I didn't fuck with them.
 24 Q: So, as you're now an active gang member, what type
 25 of violent situations were you involved in before the actual
 26 incident later on?
 27 A: I mean, just normal gang banging stuff; fighting,

1 but I controlled it; my mind level - I was thinking straight. I
 2 didn't bring no problems to the Maniacs; I stood my hood down.
 3 I made sure everything was straight.
 4 Q: Okay, and then on May 10, 1992, a friend of yours
 5 named Mudo (sp)? -
 6 A: And Mudo rest in peace.
 7 Q: He got killed by the Latin Kings?
 8 A: Yes, he did.
 9 Q: Now Mudo, was he a member of your gang or just a
 10 civilian?
 11 A: He was just a kid in the neighborhood that the
 12 brothers felt - we all took turns taking him to school because
 13 he didn't like to ride the yellow bus, and he was deaf; so, he
 14 was more embarrassed of the yellow bus, so we all took turns
 15 taking him to school. So, he just was always seen in folks
 16 cars, so they made him a target.
 17 Q: So, this was just a deaf kid that you guys were just
 18 kind of taking care of in your own way, and because of the
 19 proximity, the Latin Kings assumed that he was part of your
 20 gang?
 21 A: Yeah.
 22 Q: How was he killed exactly?
 23 A: He got shot in my car.
 24 Q: In your car?
 25 A: Yeah, he got his brains blown out.
 26 Q: But you were not in the car at the time?
 27 A: I was actually working that night selling drugs, so

1 just some normal gang banging stuff. Stuff that I went to jail
 2 for, I got locked up for selling drugs; got locked up for
 3 attempt murder; got locked up for aggravated battery.
 4 Q: The attempted murder, what was the situation about
 5 that?
 6 A: I beat a girl with a hammer.
 7 Q: Okay. Were there any shootings leading up to this?
 8 A: No. Not to where - I was always taught how to use a
 9 gun; my stepfather taught me that. So, I've always him do his
 10 dirt, but as far as me and the Maniacs, back then it wasn't so
 11 quick to pull a trigger; quick to fight. Nowadays they quick to
 12 pull the trigger. Back then we were more quick to fight each
 13 other and jump on each other instead of trying to shoot somebody
 14 up.
 15 Q: Okay, so here you are living this life and 1992
 16 rolls around, you're age 15 around this time; now you actually
 17 had moved out and you were completely living on your own.
 18 A: Yeah.
 19 Q: How were you able to actually finance that?
 20 A: Selling drugs.
 21 Q: Okay. So, you had your own apartment, you had your
 22 own car, and no one actually knew you were fifteen.
 23 A: Nobody knew I was 15; none of the Maniacs knew I was
 24 fifteen.
 25 Q: Did you feel by this time that you had a drug
 26 problem?
 27 A: No, I mean, I was tooting cocaine and popping acid,

1 that morning when it was time for me to take him to school, I
 2 was changing shifts, and he was in car and he was excited
 3 because it's Mother's Day, and he wanted me to go buy his mom
 4 something, and he kept beeping the horn, and I was talking to my
 5 folks. By the time I turned around, a car had pulled up and
 6 blew his brains out.
 7 Q: How did you react when you saw that?
 8 A: I saw nothing but fight.
 9 Q: Okay. So, your friend gets killed and you go meet
 10 with his mother.
 11 A: His mother ran out to the car; she felt it. I don't
 12 have kids, so I don't know; but they say a parent knows when
 13 something is wrong with their child because as he was shot, she
 14 ran out of the house screaming; and she ran to the car.
 15 Q: What was the conversation like with the mother at
 16 that point?
 17 A: She wasn't trying to hear nothing; all I could do
 18 was promise her that I'll get who did it.
 19 Q: So, you make a promise to Mudo's mother that you're
 20 going to avenge his death?
 21 A: Definitely.
 22 Q: How did you know that a Latin King actually pulled
 23 the trigger?
 24 A: They were calling out - they was throwing out their
 25 crowns, and calling out, know what I saying, disrespecting the
 26 Maniacs. They drove right past us.
 27 Q: So, you know it was a Latin Kings, but did you know

1 specifically who did it?
 2 A: Not at that moment, no.
 3 Q: Okay, but the hood talks; so, now word starts
 4 getting around and so forth. So, what information did you start
 5 to get after that?
 6 A: I actually got information not even from the hood.
 7 Information came from the police. Information came when they
 8 informed us that they had somebody in custody, and that they was
 9 going to court, and then informed us when they was being rounded
 10 out. So, it as never the hood that said anything, it was the
 11 police, the sheriffs in the county jail that was hitting my
 12 beeper letting me know that they was being released.
 13 Q: Okay, so you're telling me that the actual sheriff
 14 was trying to fan the flames of this beef by letting you know
 15 that this guy who allegedly killed your friend is coming out of
 16 prison - out of jail.
 17 A: Out of jail. Yeah, bonding out.
 18 Q: So, you knew who did it and his name and everything
 19 else.
 20 A: Right, at that point I knew because he went to bond
 21 hearing; I was there.
 22 Q: Oh, you went to the actual bond hearing? What was
 23 it like being in the same room with the man who killed your
 24 friend?
 25 A: I just wanted him dead.
 26 Q: Okay. So, two days later, on May 12th, you went and
 27 got two girls from the Disciples?

1 Q: So, walk me through the steps of what happens next.
 2 A: It just, we were planning to do a drive by; we was
 3 driving around, shit, but wasn't nobody in Beaches Spaulding;
 4 them bitches was out, and they was just - it was ghosts, and
 5 that was supposed to be the heart of Latin Kings. But it was
 6 ghosts; and nobody was out, so we just drove around, but the car
 7 pulled up next to us.
 8 So, when they pulled up next to us, I actually knew the
 9 driver, because like I said, my stepfather was a Latin King, and
 10 so I knew a lot of Latin Kings growing up.
 11 So, when he recognized me, he ask me what the fuck was I
 12 doing in his hood. I just, I was just driving around. But then
 13 he turnt around and seen Tutti in the back seat and he wanted to
 14 flirt with her and asked us to follow them to the park.
 15 Now, the actual person that was involved in my friend's
 16 murder was sitting on the passenger side; and he kept talking
 17 shit, oh you the famous Loca D; oh, so you Loca D? I just kept
 18 looking at him, it was like read the rumor, now meet the legend
 19 Loca D in the flesh. So, we followed them to the park.
 20 Q: Okay, and the two guys was 22 year old Hector Reyes,
 21 and 21 year old Jimmy Cruz. Who's the actual shooter?
 22 A: Hector Reyes was the actual shooter.
 23 Q: Okay, so you Hector and Jimmy, you guys go to the
 24 park?
 25 A: Yeah.
 26 Q: And the two girls?
 27 A: And the two girls.

1 A: Yeah.
 2 Q: Winneka (phonetic)?
 3 A: Yeah.
 4 Q: Am I pronouncing it right?
 5 A: Winneka, you right.
 6 Q: Winneka aka Marilyn Milero (phonetic), age 22, who
 7 actually had two kids of her own?
 8 A: Yep.
 9 Q: And Tutti.
 10 A: Tutti, yep.
 11 Q: I don't know Tutti's first name.
 12 A: Humadelyn (phonetic).
 13 Q: Madelyn, what's her last name?
 14 A: Mendoza.
 15 Q: Okay, so Tutti aka Madelyn Mendoza. How close were
 16 you to these two girls?
 17 A: I wasn't close at all with them, they was just
 18 close. Actually, Tutti's mom, I used to get high with; and
 19 Munyecka (phonetic), her brothers was my folks. So, I knew her
 20 brothers. So, I really didn't know them.
 21 Q: So, the three of you got together and planned a
 22 mission to get revenge.
 23 A: Yep.
 24 Q: You guys got a 25 caliber pistol?
 25 A: Yep.
 26 Q: Now, originally the plan was to do a drive by?
 27 A: Yep.

1 Q: Tutti and Winneka. So, once you get to the park,
 2 what happens next?
 3 A: Well actually out of respect for the Dicken's family
 4 because they are [indiscernible] now, I wouldn't even want them
 5 to relive that shit; just to know that we did go to the park; we
 6 all was talking. They had their guns, we had ours.
 7 I was invited into the bathroom. He acted tough until we
 8 got in the bathroom. When we got in bathroom, it was whole
 9 different situation; he pulled his dick out, and tried to act
 10 like he wants to fuck.
 11 And when I didn't want to do that, he mentioned
 12 [indiscernible]; like, it's about that, and that's when I pulled
 13 the trigger.
 14 Q: Okay. You pulled the trigger; Hector Reyes is now
 15 dead in front of you. What goes through your head as you're
 16 looking at this dead body?
 17 A: Nothing. This is something I've seen my whole life.
 18 Living in the streets of Chicago, you can walk past a dead body
 19 that's normal. Looking at people with their head blown off was
 20 normal; was nothing sickening; it was just everyday life. So,
 21 nothing at that moment went through my head.
 22 Q: Well, seeing a dead body, or seeing someone get
 23 killed is one thing, but actually pulling the trigger yourself,
 24 is a little bit different.
 25 A: Not to me. I didn't have conscious then - at this
 26 moment, yeah, but at that moment at the age of 15, I didn't give
 27 a fuck, like why would you kill my friend. You killed my

1 friend, it was no coming back from that; I didn't give a fuck; I
 2 wasn't thinking or I didn't know; at this moment, I do; this
 3 moment is a lot of fears, a lot of emotions where I took two
 4 lives. I ruined four families, five families; so, I mean, back
 5 then a child doesn't think that.

6 Back then a child thinks that's oh, it's just down to do
 7 whatever.

8 Q: After you killed Hector Reyes, you come out of the
 9 bathroom and Jimmy Cruz is there as well as Winneka and Tutti?

10 A: Yes.

11 Q: So, what happens next?

12 A: I guess Jimmy thought that I was the one that had
 13 died. He wasn't expecting to see me walk out that bathroom.
 14 So, when he saw that it was me and not his friend, and after he
 15 heard the gunshot, he knew then his friend was dead.

16 So, he went to reach for his gun, but he was about to kill
 17 one of my girls, and I wasn't going to let that happen. So, I
 18 just took off running, and as I was running, I pulled the
 19 trigger and it hit him in the head.

20 Q: So, then you and your two friends jump back into the
 21 car again?

22 A: No, actually, I stood over Jimmy's body and one of
 23 the Latin Kings car passed by. Of course, he recognized me,
 24 because like I said, my stepfather; so, instead of I'm thinking
 25 in my head, he's going to go get the Latin Kings, we finna die
 26 right here.

27 But instead, he called my stepfather, and he told my

1 A: Yep.

2 Q: And you and the mother had a conversation at that
 3 point?

4 A: Yep. We organized the way we went in the funeral.
 5 All of us went in the funeral every other person, you know what
 6 I'm saying; because we really believed that it was going to be a
 7 problem.

8 So, we went prepared for problems. So, we went in, we put
 9 a flower on the casket and then went to the mother and gave her
 10 a dozen of roses and told her I did it.

11 Q: How did she react?

12 A: She just cried and said, thank you.

13 Q: At that moment did you feel a sense of closure over
 14 the whole situation?

15 A: Yeah, but I knew it was going to be some
 16 consequences behind it; but I didn't think it would be prison
 17 time.

18 Q: Okay. So, behind your back, the police now know
 19 that you and the other two girls did it, and they're now
 20 preparing to arrest you.

21 A: Yeah, there was actually surveillance outside the
 22 funeral home we didn't know nothing about.

23 Q: Right. So, they actually arrest you at the funeral
 24 home?

25 A: They arrested me leaving the funeral home going back
 26 to the neighborhood. Once we got in the neighborhood, that's
 27 when they arrested us.

1 father, your daughter just killed one of our boys. He didn't
 2 know nothing about the boy in the bathroom. He just saw the
 3 body outside. So, he made a deal with my stepfather; so instead
 4 of going to get the Latin Kings, he went and picked up some
 5 drugs from my dad and I was able to get out of the parking lot.

6 Q: Now you get out of the parking lot, you and the two
 7 girls drive off?

8 A: Huh huh.

9 Q: What happens next?

10 A: We head to the neighborhood, of course the bitches
 11 wasn't bitching; the girls started bragging about it. Oh, Loca
 12 D did this, Loca did this, Loca that, so they bragged to the
 13 wrong person. One of the girls that they were bragging to ended
 14 up getting locked up for some kilo cocaine that night. So, she
 15 end up turning us in to get free.

16 Q: Okay. Well, that's happening without you knowing;
 17 so this girl is now started to cooperate with the police; but
 18 you still think that you got away with it to a certain degree
 19 because the Latin King who saw you got paid off, he's not going
 20 to say anything. So, you went to a hotel, right?

21 A: Yeah, I actually ran from my - because my stepfather
 22 was making me come home; I was supposed to go to Puerto Rico;
 23 and he kept telling me, my mom is going to pack my clothes in my
 24 house, and I was actually supposed to go to Puerto Rico, but I
 25 wasn't going to miss Mudo's funeral.

26 So, I went to a hotel room with the folks.

27 Q: Okay, and then the next day you went to the funeral?

1 Q: When they arrested you, what went through your head?

2 A: They never said it was for the murders; now mind
 3 you, we deep as fuck, you know what I'm saying, we just came
 4 from a funeral; so, a lot of us was out there; so, as I was
 5 giving up my guns because I'm going to Puerto Rico now. So, as
 6 I was giving up my guns Winneka called me to the corner and was
 7 like, man what's up, you going to say bye without me; you were
 8 going to leave without saying bye? So, as I walked over to her
 9 to give her a handshake, the polices came.

10 So, I'm like, what the fuck. Well, the first thing I get
 11 to yelling is, I'm 15 years old, don't handcuff me. So, that's
 12 when everybody got to realizing, what the fuck did she just say?
 13 All I heard was whispers like, what the fuck; and the police
 14 was like what? I'm 15 years old, don't handcuff me. My cousin
 15 was like, she fifteen.

16 So, we was in the police car, Winneka had informed me at
 17 that moment that the night before they jumped on a pregnant
 18 girl, so she thought that's what we was getting locked up for.
 19 We didn't know we was getting locked up for the murder until the
 20 detectives drove us to the scene of the crime.

21 And when they took us to the park; they pulled out a gun,
 22 and they said which one of ya'll want to take this gun and shoot
 23 me in the back of the head while I'm using the bathroom? So, at
 24 that moment that's when I knew of what I was fuckin locked up
 25 for.

26 Then they took us to Beaches Spaulding, which is the heart
 27 of the Latin Kings, had them Latin Kings surround my car, well

1 the police car, and I was in the back seat; and one of them had
 2 a gun to the window, and they was like, yeah, that's her. At
 3 that moment, I realized - I'm looking at it now thinking back, I
 4 realize I was a child for real because all I remember saying
 5 was, it wasn't me. What are you talking about, it wasn't me.
 6

At that moment, a child came out. But, that how I knew I
 was being locked up for murder.

Q: So, the detective in the car with you pulled up to a
 Latin King area and Latin Kings were pulling out guns with the
 detective present and he was allowing all of this to happen?

A: Actually, the detectives are now actually convicted.
 They were convicted and charged for being dirty cops.

Q: Right, we'll talk about that later on because I know
 that part of the story as well.

A: Yeah, he definitely did that. And it was letting us
 know either ya'll gone sign a statement, or we gone let you out
 right here. I would have never survived had they let me out
 right there. So, we was like, we'll sign a statement.

Q: So, you signed the statements right there in the
 car?

A: No, they took us to the police station.

Q: Okay, so they take you back to the precinct and
 there was some sort of issue about your mother actually being
 present and so forth?

A: Yeah, they wouldn't let my mom in, they actually
 went to my mom's house and told her I was a witness to a murder,
 and that they were holding me under protective custody. And

1 A: Yeah.

2 Q: And she spent 20 hours in police custody, they
 3 threatened her with life in prison, they also threatened her
 4 with taking her away from her kids, and her defense attorney
 5 actually recommended that she sign a guilty plea with no
 6 conditions attached.

7 A: Yeah, yeah. She signed the statement as well
 8 because they kept telling her that either she was going to sign
 9 the statement and say that I killed one, and she killed one, or
 10 I was going to say she killed both of them. And likewise, they
 11 was telling me, I was going to sign a statement saying, I killed
 12 one and she killed one, or she was going to say, I killed both
 13 of them.

14 Q: Right, because the statement that you signed at
 15 that time said that you killed one in the bathroom, came outside
 16 and gave the gun to Winneka, and she shot the other, which
 17 doesn't make a lot of sense because if you hear a gunshot coming
 18 out of the bathroom, you wouldn't be able to just calmly give a
 19 gun to someone else.

20 A: Exactly, exactly, but see that's how the officers
 21 had worded it, you know what I'm saying, they wanted both of us
 22 to go down. So, she - we both signed statements.

23 Q: Right, and the third girl, Tutti, she turned herself
 24 in shortly after?

25 A: Yeah, she turned herself in because when it was time
 26 - she was coming out of the store, and when it was time for
 27 Yvette to point her out, to say that was her, we had realized

1 when she kept asking them can I go see my baby, they kept
 2 telling her we are going to call you and tell you when you can
 3 come.

4 She waited, waited and waited and they never called her,
 5 so she came on her own. And when she got to the police station,
 6 they still wasn't letting her talk to me until my statement was
 7 signed.

8 They didn't even search me because when I said that I was
 9 a juvenile, they never searched me or nothing; so, I still had
 10 acid on me; I was still popping acid the whole time I was in the
 11 precinct.

12 So, by the time my momma came, they had gave me a pack of
 13 cigarettes, knowing I was six years old, they gave me my pack of
 14 cigarettes, they took pictures of me laughing and smiling; I was
 15 tripping off acid, right.

16 And they still, you know what I'm saying - so, when my
 17 mother - after I signed the statement, there was no youth
 18 officer present, no - my momma wasn't there, they all just came;
 19 the statement was already prepared.

20 So, when I signed the statement, they let my mother in,
 21 and mother informed them like ya'll do know she's intoxicated?
 22 And they didn't even want to take no bloodwork, they was like
 23 naw she's not. She was like, she is, it's hard to get - her
 24 eyes are bucked. She's intoxicated and ya'll just questioned
 25 her being intoxicated.

26 Q: Well, at the same time when Winneka was also
 27 arrested.

1 that someone was pointing us out because we had heard it on the
 2 radio, the identification; that somebody was identifying me and
 3 Winneka.

4 So, when they did that, the little kids in the
 5 neighborhood, I was yelling at them letting them know,
 6 somebody's pointing us out; somebody's identifying us. So, the
 7 whole neighborhood went crazy looking for this marked car or
 8 unmarked car, and they found the van. So, they had to take off
 9 with the witness inside.

10 So, by the time they did that, she wasn't able to identify
 11 Tutti coming out of the store. So, Tutti turned herself in with
 12 a lawyer.

13 Q: Well, after the dusk settled, you get indicted by a
 14 grand jury for murder?

15 A: Yes.

16 Q: So, now you're in jail awaiting trial; no bond, I
 17 assumed?

18 A: Nope.

19 Q: Now, your stepdad who's a Latin King, is somehow
 20 caught in the middle of all of this.

21 A: Of course.

22 Q: And I guess your house got shot up?

23 A: Yeah. My house got shot up and my dad ended up
 24 shooting one of his gang members as they were trying to come in
 25 my house. He shot them in the ass, but he ended up shooting one
 26 of his gang members, and yes, they did shoot up my house.

27 Q: And he ended up leaving the Latin Kings over the

18

20



1 situation?

2 A: He had to, I mean, the Lord of the Latin Kings
 3 actually called him on a meeting in prison, and was like, how
 4 could you do that; and he was like, what you mean, that was my
 5 daughters decision. He was like well, I knew her since she was
 6 a baby, and she was like, she chose her own route.

7 I couldn't make my daughter be a Latin Queen, she chose
 8 who she wanted to be; she chose her life; so Lord Jim made it
 9 clear that that was unforgivable, and that my father had to
 10 leave; so he left.

11 Q: Okay. So, now you're waiting in jail until the
 12 trial. You have a Public Defender, so it's not like you have
 13 the top legal representation. It takes four years until it
 14 actually goes to trial?

15 A: Yeah, actually, no, that's not true. Call my case
 16 manager, I was convicted in 93. That's my first conviction. It
 17 took about a year and a half. They waited until actually
 18 seventeen and I got convicted; I got found guilty August 5,
 19 1993; and by September, I was sentenced to life in prison
 20 sentence and sent on to prison.

21 Q: Okay, you became the first female juvenile to get
 22 life in prison?

23 A: Yes.

24 Q: And this was life in prison with no possibility of
 25 parole?

26 A: Yes.

27 Q: Now, that initial conviction, wasn't there an issue

21 year old in a prison full of grown women, and guards both male
 22 and female guards, right?

3 A: Yep.

4 Q: What was that first day like?

5 A: I mean, it was nothing like I saw on tv. Shit - I
 6 mean, walking into a prison full of nothing but grownups and me
 7 being the person I was, I didn't find Jackie until years later;
 8 so, I went into prison as Loca D.

9 So, I wasn't scared of nobody; I was scared
 10 [indiscernible]. A bitch, I'm not; never have been, never will
 11 be. So, to the point where when I went in I kept looking
 12 around, and it's a lot of people out there, so I'm actually in a
 13 cell, and I'm thinking in my head, what the fuck, they about to
 14 make me somebody bitch.

15 Like I'm the youngest one, I'm fine as fuck, and somebody
 16 had actually came to my door with a bag of clothes, and tv, and
 17 all types of shit; and I'm like, I'm not finna be your bitch,
 18 what is wrong with you; but it wasn't even that, but in my head
 19 because that's what I see on tv, that's what they do, that's
 20 what I thought they was trying to do.

21 But, I said aht aht, ya'll ain't finna make me your bitch,
 22 that ain't going to happen, you know what I'm saying, but as
 23 time went by, as weeks went by, I got to realize it wasn't even
 24 like that and everybody was really trying to figure out who was
 25 the kid in the prison because that's exactly what I was, a kid
 26 in a grown ass prison.

27 Q: Well, early on, you get approached by a group of

23

1 with your mother not being able to see you?

2 A: That's what brought me back in 96. That's what
 3 actually brought me back in 96 because the United States Supreme
 4 Court threw out the statement because my mother wasn't present;
 5 I had no youth officer present; nobody was there but me and the
 6 detectives when the statement was being taken.

7 So, it was thrown out and I ended up going back in 96 for
 8 a re-trial; and the Judge was upset because I wouldn't take the
 9 offer that was on the table, and she brought the statement back in
 10 after the United States Supreme Court threw it out.

11 Q: Okay, what was the offer that they were giving you
 12 at that time?

13 A: Twenty-five years.

14 Q: Okay, why did you turn down the 25 years?

15 A: Money hunger, and young and stupid.

16 Q: Right, because in retrospect, that would have
 17 actually got you out a lot sooner.

18 A: I would have been home way sooner.

19 Q: Because later on when they essentially said that it
 20 was unconstitutional to convict a juvenile to life in prison
 21 without parole, your sentence was changed to 63 years.

22 A: Yeah, 63 years at 50%.

23 Q: Ok, got it. We'll get to that part a little bit
 24 later. So, here you are, you're now serving prison as a 17 year
 25 old.

26 A: Yeah.

27 Q: And not only a 17 year old, but a very notorious 17

1 women and [interrupted].

2 A: The first day out. Yeah, the first day out after
 3 I'm clear because when you go to prison you got to go through
 4 medical, so once your medical clears, you're able to walk the
 5 compound.

6 So, the very first day that I was approached by some Latin
 7 Queens and surrounded; I was going into the yard, and but it was
 8 just one little old lady right there too. So, as I walked into
 9 the yard, the old lady looked at me and noticed that I was being
 10 surrounded; so, I pulled out my shank, and the old lady spit in
 11 my face.

12 So, I'm like, what the fuck; and me - one thing about
 13 Hispanics, we are very big on respecting our elders. So, I
 14 realized that she said you killed my nephew, I realized that the
 15 victim's family, I just put my head down; I gave her her
 16 respect.

17 But as of at that moment that's when Senna from the Latin
 18 Queens was right next to her, and she spoke up, and I said you
 19 won't get the same respect though. [Laughs] You won't get it.

20 So, as soon as she did that, I had already threw up my
 21 pitchfork, and GD's came, Maniac's came, you know what I'm
 22 saying, [indiscernible] gangster's came; a lot of the folks came
 23 through, and they broke up the little circle, and was like ain't
 24 nothing happening, you know what I'm saying; ain't nothing finna
 25 happen to her, we ain't doing this, we finna start a war in this
 26 bitch, and ya'll don't want it; it ain't that many of ya'll;
 27 ya'll can't fuck with her.

1 So, they remerged around, but as I was walking, I realized
 2 I had blood everywhere on me, and I didn't know where the fuck
 3 it came from, and I was like what the fuck, did someone just
 4 stab me, but I didn't know. But when I looked to the right,
 5 somebody else was being stabbed up next to me; and I was like
 6 bitch, they gone kill me in prison because I like to fight, I
 7 got a mouth, and I'm going to die in prison; it is what it is.

8 Q: Well, you already have a knife on day one.

9 A: Definitely.

10 Q: Were there situations where you had to use that
 11 knife?

12 A: Yeah, I actually caught a case. I caught a case in
 13 prison where I stabbed the officer, busted a officer's head;
 14 shit - I have to keep it, you know what I'm saying.

15 One of the Latin Queens stabbed me; I got stabbed in my
 16 arm, and once she tried to slice my throat, you know what I'm
 17 saying, snatched it off, and I ended up stabbing her; I mean
 18 that was just the norm.

19 Q: Well, by 2005, you actually gave a statement and you
 20 changed your original statement where you actually admitted that
 21 Winneka was not the other shooter; that you had shot both men
 22 yourself. What made you do that?

23 A: What made me do that was the fact that I'd grown up
 24 and I had a conscious; like I said, I'm not the person I used to
 25 be. Loca D is gone, you know what I'm saying; I'm retired; I'm
 26 a women; I have a heart now; I have feelings. I was not about
 27 to let a women - even though she didn't pull the trigger, even

1 A: When I lost my backbone, my mother, you know what
 2 I'm saying, she died of cancer. I was actually in confinement
 3 when they released me early out of confinement because my mother
 4 was dying - I was in confinement for knocking a girl's eyeball
 5 out her head; so, me - I was doing a year and a half in
 6 confinement because while in confinement, I beat somebody else
 7 up, you know.

8 So, in the process of that my mother was dying and I
 9 didn't know nothing about it. So, they actually let me out of
 10 confinement early so that I could see my mother, and I didn't
 11 understand why I was getting out of confinement, and I only did
 12 a year and I still had six more months to go.

13 So, when they released me, my mother came to see me March
 14 1, 2008, and while on the visit, she still didn't tell me that
 15 she only had a certain amount of weeks left to live. But seeing
 16 my mother and her kissing my face and playing in my hair and
 17 hugging me and not letting me go, then she couldn't breath for a
 18 second, and still didn't realize it when I saw all the medical
 19 team was already in the visiting room, and I still didn't put
 20 two and two together because I would never thought no shit like
 21 that; who thinks that you're going to visit your momma for the
 22 last day; for the last time.

23 So, my mother actually stopped breathing in the visiting
 24 room. So, it was like okay, this is over, she got to go; the
 25 ambulance was already there. So, I'm like what the fuck, you
 26 know what I'm saying, I'm still not putting shit together. My
 27 mother died two weeks later after that. So, I lost the one

25

27

1 though she didn't do all of that, I wasn't about to let her be
 2 in prison for something I did.

3 They took her off the death penalty; she had to do two
 4 life sentences; she got kids, grandkids; and it just didn't feel
 5 right to me that I was going to walk the streets after pulling
 6 the trigger and she was still going to be in prison.

7 So, I had to modify the statement and say she knew nothing
 8 about it, you know what I'm saying, I made her come with me just
 9 so she could come home. I had to make it seem like she didn't
 10 know absolutely nothing; because if I didn't she was going to
 11 stay in prison for something she didn't do, she didn't pull no
 12 trigger.

13 Q: Well, initially, you got life without parole when
 14 Winneka got life with - she got the death penalty.

15 A: She got the death penalty.

16 Q: No life, the death penalty. Tutti, what was she
 17 sentenced for?

18 A: Yep, she copped out 35 years; she did 17 ½ and went
 19 home in 09.

20 Q: Okay, so now you change your statement, and Winneka
 21 starts to go to the PO's Board, but the first few times they
 22 don't actually accept her, and we'll get to the story a little
 23 bit later on. Three years after you change your story in 2008,
 24 your mother died. And that was a major turning point in your
 25 life.

26 A: Yep, that's when I changed my life.

27 Q: So, what happened at that point?

1 person might have been my hero.

2 Q: I'm sorry for your loss. And was that the moment
 3 that you said, I'm done with this gang shit?

4 A: Yeah. That's the moment I let everything go. I had
 5 already been incarcerated 16 years; I don't even have a GED; you
 6 know what I'm saying, I didn't have anything. I had devoted my
 7 life to gang banging, you know what I'm saying, and I was
 8 determined to always remain Loca D, but when I lost my momma, I
 9 had to learn how to be - I couldn't live in prison no more.

10 I wanted to do things that my mother always wanted me to
 11 do, and I was determined to do that. So, in order for me to do
 12 that, I had to learn how to feel, I had to learn how to care, I
 13 had to learn how to love, and I went to school, I went to
 14 school, and I kept going to school; and I wasn't going to stop
 15 until I felt like I made my mother proud.

16 And within not even a month, I had got a GED, and I hadn't
 17 been to school in 16 years. So, I got my GED, then I went to
 18 college and got a Certified Dog Groomer, got licensed in dog
 19 grooming, dog training; I went and did everything I could do in
 20 prison, you know what I'm saying, people talking about you got
 21 life in prison, what you doing all of that for? I was like, I'm
 22 going home.

23 I'm going home, I'm going to fight for this, and I did it;
 24 and I avoided every situation that would bring me down or take
 25 me back.

26 Q: Well, that next year 2009, Northwestern Law came in
 27 and said they wanted to fight your case.

1 A: Yep, yep.
 2 Q: And with them behind you, the Supreme Court actually
 3 ruled that mandatory life in prison was unconstitutional for a
 4 juvenile.
 5 A: Yes, sir.
 6 Q: So, they sent the case back to Cook County, and that
 7 was the situation we talked about before where you were given
 8 what, a twenty-five year plea deal?
 9 A: No, no that wasn't the 25 plea deal. That was 2000,
 10 2029. It was 1996 when they gave me the 25 plea deal and I
 11 wouldn't take it.
 12 Q: Ah huh.
 13 A: 2009, is when Northwestern came into my life, and
 14 they started changing the laws and stuff, and when I went back
 15 in 2015, that's when I went for my whole reassessing hearing,
 16 and they gave me the 63 years at 50%.
 17 Q: Okay, so when you suddenly go from life in prison,
 18 mandatory life to 63 years, which is 50% because it's a state
 19 case, right?
 20 A: Yes.
 21 Q: So, that's 31 and a half years.
 22 A: Yes, sir.
 23 Q: And at that point, you had served how many years?
 24 A: I had already served twenty-seven. I thought I did
 25 a little bit less than that because when I got my sentence I
 26 actually had to do 7 more years, that's how it went. I had to
 27 do 7 more years. So, at first they kept trying to say, naw,

1 A: Yep. Yes, he was.
 2 Q: When all of that information came out about that
 3 cop, what did you think?
 4 A: Kim Fox had actually sent me some mail. I was
 5 already in Florida prison, I had [indiscernible] interstate
 6 compact; and I was already in Florida prison, and she had sent
 7 me a letter and said that they were going to reopen my case
 8 because it had ended that I was looking at a lawsuit, and I
 9 declined it.
 10 Because, I mean Melaros took its course, you know what I'm
 11 saying, I understand, but I declined it because I knew I was
 12 guilty; and I didn't feel the need to - even though they did me
 13 wrong, don't get me wrong, they did exactly what the fuck they
 14 did with everybody else, the only thing different was I was
 15 guilty.
 16 But the way they treated a child was unconstitutional.
 17 The way they paraded me in front of cameras was
 18 unconstitutional. They should have blocked my face, but they
 19 never did. That's the whole point of me getting all the threats
 20 and the stabbings and people wanting to kill me because my face
 21 was never blocked as a child, and it should have been.
 22 And so, they did me dirty, but at the end of the day in my
 23 mind - and I tell Melaros the same thing today, I feel like
 24 you're pursuing this innocent project, or you're pursuing the
 25 conviction, getting money off of detective, I feel like it's
 26 Karma's a motherfucker, man. Like, I feel like you trying to
 27 get paid for being involved in a murder; like you was involved,

31

1 we'll give you eighty years; I was like, I'm going home.
 2 I'm fighting this to the bitter end. We going to fight it
 3 until the paint come off this wall. And they kept changing
 4 Judges because I had one Judge that was, awe you'll never going
 5 home, then I had another Judge that was more sympathetic, and
 6 for some reason, I knew that my guy was powerful because he kept
 7 removing every obstacle that was trying to stop me from going
 8 home.
 9 And I knew my mom was in his ear, like I'm a firm
 10 believer, my mother, in my eyes was a super woman, and she
 11 fought a lot of cancers and a lot of diseases that my mom had
 12 went through hysterectomy, pacemakers, cancer, and she fought it
 13 off, but for some reason at the end she died of lung cancer; and
 14 I think that my mother gave up on purpose because she felt she
 15 needed to go up there and get me home.
 16 Q: Well, like we said in 2016, you got resentenced to
 17 63 years; you now had a date that you were coming home. A few
 18 years later 2019, Winneka goes to the prison review board for
 19 the third time. And by this time, there was some more
 20 information, and that is one of the key detectives to your case,
 21 Reynaldo Guevera, he was involved in framing at least 51 people
 22 for murder.
 23 Nineteen people were exonerated in cases that he had
 24 investigated. Several included false confessions, beatings and
 25 coercion, and everything else like that. This is the same cop
 26 that had you in the car with the Latin Kings pulling the guns
 27 out.

1 bro.
 2 I would feel like, you're trying to pay me to kill, but
 3 you're paying me for the killing, no, I did it; and I refuse,
 4 man, like I refused -- you don't know how many times people tell
 5 me, no, go for it. No, I refuse to collect any type of money
 6 behind the detective because I was guilty.
 7 And as hard as it is living out here today, I still can
 8 say, I can't accept it; I'm just going to work hard to do what I
 9 got to do.
 10 Q: Well, Winneka got out in 2020, right?
 11 A: Yes, she did. April 2020.
 12 Q: And she filed a lawsuit against the police
 13 department.
 14 A: Yeah.
 15 Q: How much money is she actually seeking?
 16 A: Actually, all together, 17.5 million dollars with
 17 the police and the unlawful conviction because after I was
 18 resentenced, I got on tv and said she knew nothing about it, you
 19 know what I'm saying, so, that helped with it.
 20 So, now she's seeking 17.5 million dollars, which she'll
 21 get, she'll get it. I just don't want to have no parts of it,
 22 you know what I'm saying. I just want to live a normal life.
 23 Q: Okay, I'm assuming, unless there's a settlement,
 24 which I guess there is most of the time, but if you were to get
 25 on the stand, you'd have to say that, well I said this, but then
 26 I said this, and now I'm saying this; there's some flip-flopping
 27 in terms of your story.

1 A: But I'm not getting on her stand. I'm going to let
 2 her do what she got to do because, like I say, I don't want her
 3 promise a motherfucker; I feel like today, like I told you, I'm
 4 a different person today. I have a heart and I have conscious.

5 So, I wouldn't want to put the victim's family through
 6 that again; let them rest in peace; you know what I'm saying,
 7 out of respect for the dead, their family, just let the shit go,
 8 it's been 31 years and when shit like this keeps coming up, it's
 9 like pouring salt into a wound.

10 I understand that, and I didn't understand it before, but
 11 I understand now because my brother was just murdered, and
 12 there's no way possible that I want to keep seeing that shit.
 13 Every fuckin day somebody's talking about him dying, and him
 14 getting killed. What the fuck, let him rest in peace. He's not
 15 going to rest in peace unless ya'll let this shit go.

16 Q: Well, justice here, you finally get released.

17 A: Yeah.

18 Q: After doing 31 years in prison. So, when you look
 19 at your whole life, you spent every day that you were alive
 20 outside of prison, you spent two days in prison.

21 A: Yes, sir.

22 Q: Two-thirds of your life was spent in a cage.

23 A: Yes, sir.

24 Q: As you're walking out in your forties, how hard is
 25 it to deal with this outside world that you really have no idea
 26 what's it's about.

27 A: I still don't know what it's about. I mean, I'm not

1 Like, I'm 46 years old, working two jobs; like I have seizures,
 2 I'm very ill, I'm not doing too good, but I wake up every
 3 morning and I go to work when my bones be hurting, but I have to
 4 go because I know that I have responsibility.

5 Q: Well, your stepfather who was raping you from the
 6 age of 7 actually turned his life around, left the gang, found
 7 God, and I guess he actually visited you every week the whole
 8 time you were locked?

9 A: The whole time I was in prison, my stepfather was
 10 there. He made sure that I saw my nieces and nephews grow up;
 11 he made sure - yes, he did, he turned his whole life around, and
 12 in the beginning I was mad, don't get me wrong because I'm
 13 sitting in prison for life and motherfucker, I'm the product of
 14 you.

15 You made me, you trained me to be a killer. I just so
 16 happen to go to the Maniacs and not want to fuck with the Latin
 17 Kings. So, you made me who the fuck I was, and you going to
 18 give all shit - give me the fuckin money, what is wrong with
 19 you.

20 He literally gave his life over to God and gave up
 21 everything. Houses, cars, everything he ever owned and donated
 22 it to Red Cross. Took his family to a shelter home and started
 23 fresh. I will say today, my stepfather is a man of God, he
 24 really is. He is very apologetic to me; every time he speaks to
 25 me, he tells me he's sorry.

26 Like I told him, I forgave him a long time ago when he
 27 held my momma's hand, and she was dying. Because it went from

1 going to sit here and try and act like I'm hard, I still don't
 2 know nothing about society. I work two jobs; I'm trying to
 3 maintain rent and utilities; I'm trying to work with kids now;
 4 I'm actually now trying to open up a program to get some
 5 assistance to open up a dog grooming and dog training; I told
 6 you I was licensed.

7 And I wanted to do it, but instead of kids joining gangs
 8 and getting high like I did, come and learn a trade. And it's
 9 something fun, and something for them to do. So, I'm trying my
 10 hardest to build that, I really am.

11 I just opened up a GoFundMe to try to help me get that
 12 done. But like I said, I'm working two jobs and I still haven't
 13 got it right. I have bars on my window because I still need to
 14 feel like I'm in prison sometimes.

15 I wake up in the middle of the night and realize, oh my
 16 God, I'm in a real bed. Like I can get up - sometimes I wake up
 17 and look around and thinking the officer is going to do a walk
 18 through so I can ask him if I can go to the bathroom. I just
 19 did that for 31 years, so that's the shit that I'm accustomed to
 20 right now.

21 And it's hard as fuck out here; it's not easy. It's not
 22 easy when you don't have nobody to support you, or nobody to
 23 help you because you're a convicted murderer. Nobody wants to
 24 understand that I was a child, a child, a real child.

25 But see if it was their child, they would want somebody to
 26 help them. But see me coming home to nothing and no one to help
 27 me, nobody understands that when I say, I really need some help.

1 beating us, beating my mother, breaking her bone, beating the
 2 hell out of my momma to taking her baths when she couldn't even
 3 move; and being there when she died.

4 So, for that I had to forgive him; I had to.

5 Q: Well, right now you're out, but you're actually on
 6 probation?

7 A: Parole.

8 Q: Parole. You have an ankle bracelet?

9 A: Not no more.

10 Q: It's gone?

11 A: I just got it off. Just got it off actually two
 12 weeks ago.

13 Q: How did that feel?

14 A: I did feel great. I did feel free. I was able to
 15 travel; I got on a plane; you know what I'm saying, I was able
 16 to travel; I was able to drive places; I'm able to get into a
 17 pool; actually, soon as I got it off, I ain't going to lie it
 18 you, that goes to show you how little I am. You know they say
 19 when you come out of prison, you in the same state of mind as
 20 you was the age you went in; so, my 15 year old me came out when
 21 I got that bracelet off.

22 I had went right in the bathtub, put a whole bunch of
 23 [indiscernible] in it and later, I fell asleep in there. My
 24 niece left me in there, in the hotel room, in the bathroom
 25 sleeping for hours. I woke up all wrinkled up like an old lady.
 26 I ain't know what the hell was wrong with me.

27 But it felt good, it felt good to be able to go into a

1 pool; to be able to go and take a bath; the little things. It
 2 felt so good.
 3 Q: I love it, I love it. But you're actually on parole
 4 for three years?

5 A: Yes, sir.

6 Q: Well, here you are, you're coming out of this
 7 environment where someone bumping into you or giving you a dirty
 8 look, or not being polite, could be the last thing they do. It
 9 could trigger into a stabbing, a murder, whatever.

10 A: That's crazy that you said that. We just had that
 11 situation, me and my niece was at the store, and we was
 12 shopping; it was a self-checkout. It was open but there was
 13 some other people lined up; so you ain't getting to go over
 14 there, so I'm going to go over there.

15 So, soon as I was going that way, the girl stepped up and
 16 told her don't grab that machine; Oh my God, I'm going to shut
 17 up, you know what I'm saying. So, I was like, told my niece, I
 18 say well go grab that one. So, soon as she went to grab that
 19 one, the lady jumped from that one to that one.

20 And I was like, bitch are you going to make up your
 21 motherfuckin mind, pussy ass hoe, what the fuck - I just went
 22 there. And all I could hear my niece saying was please let's
 23 just go. Please let's just go. I looked at her, I said man,
 24 pay for this shit and let's get the fuck out of here, I said
 25 because bitch, you'll send me back to jail, bitch; I'll beat the
 26 fuck out your ass.

27 With you and your kids, bitch. And then I just went

1 better check yourself.

2 Q: Right, because even though you're out in the world,
 3 you're actually not behind bars, do not exactly [indiscernible].
 4 Being on parole just means that you're still in prison but
 5 allowed to function outside, which means that you don't have the
 6 same set of rights that a normal US citizen has.

7 A: Exactly.

8 Q: They don't need probable cause to search your car,
 9 or your house. They can go in whenever they want, they could
 10 really do whatever they want, the same thing as a prison; and if
 11 they find drugs, guns - [interrupted].

12 A: Yes, I'm going back.

13 Q: You're going back and how long are you going back
 14 for?

15 A: To finish off my 63 years.

16 Q: Oh God, so you're going to go back for 30 years.

17 A: Yep.

18 Q: Ooh, that's a heavy toll right there.

19 A: Yeah.

20 Q: Have you tried to get counseling or therapy to try
 21 and deal with these anger issues?

22 A: I have. I went to - I going to therapy; I think
 23 that I'm facing the fact of trying to forgive myself for the
 24 murders. I think that's what's holding me back. And I have to
 25 learn to forgive my mom for leaving me. So, I'm going through
 26 grief process right now, and I'm working on that; I'm going to
 27 counseling for that.

1 there, she was like, I ain't going to argue - I said bitch shut
 2 the fuck up - I just went there because that's what I'm used to.
 3 You know, and like you said, in prison ain't no arguing, we
 4 ain't doing all of that. It took my niece's voice in my ear to

 9 spot in a line. That's simple, like grandma say, that's simple;
 10 I pops back in and pops back out; and I have to tell myself
 11 like, damn I got to go, let me just go.

12 And I went home and that night I just sat in the pool, and
 13 I just looked around and I thought about that night, and I was
 14 just like, God you got to get that prison mentality out of me.
 15 Like I don't want to be like that, I'm not in prison no more.
 16 I'm not, and I have to learn how to live in society, but I just
 17 don't know how.

18 Q: That woman was not a physical threat to you; she
 19 just had a bad attitude.

20 A: Yes.

21 Q: Right, but one small altercation, a punch, a slap
 22 whatever, you're going back to prison, you're violating your
 23 parole, right?

24 A: Exactly, exactly. I've got to remind myself daily
 25 that I'm not in prison, but I can be in a blink of an eye. So,
 26 I have to remind myself like, I check myself daily; like bitch
 27 that could be the day that you end up back in prison, so you

1 I'm going to counseling - because I do have to forgive
 2 myself. I was a child; I made a mistake; I know nothing; I
 3 thought I was cool to avenge my friend's murder, you know what
 4 I'm saying. Because in my mind because that's what the hell I
 5 was trained and taught to do all my life.

6 I'm just loyal [indiscernible]. I have that bad, and I
 7 have to start like thinking, damn, Jackie, is these
 8 motherfuckers loyal to you? But, I'm like that, I'm loyal as
 9 fuck; and it could be with anybody, it doesn't have to be with a
 10 gang; it doesn't have to be with family. I am hard now. I
 11 literally go down the street and people be begging for money; I
 12 know what you're begging for, but I still give it to them, I'll
 13 give up my last.

14 I don't know, I've become a [indiscernible] maybe I could
 15 say, but I'm okay with that. I've become a crybaby and I'm okay
 16 with that, you know what I'm saying, because when I used to be a
 17 gang member, and I was so cold-hearted, I didn't give a fuck if
 18 I killed you in front of your kids.

19 I didn't give a fuck if I killed your kids. I didn't give
 20 a fuck, I didn't care. So, right now, I cry watching tv shows.
 21 I'm like, the fuck are you crying for [laughs], but I am a new
 22 person, I'm a new person and I love it.

23 Q: Well, and now you're actually married to a woman.

24 A: I'm a wife, yes, I do, love her death, Yvonne, I am
 25 married and I love my wife to death, and she is a very good
 26 supporter; she's been here through my whole incarceration, she's
 27 been there.

1 She's been on and off, but she's been there. So, and my
 2 family adores her; my family, she knows my whole family, and
 3 she's just like one of the family members to them.
 4 Q: Well, in prison because before prison, you had dated
 5 guys, right?

6 A: No.

7 Q: No, not at all?

8 A: Not really; I had a boyfriend; I did have a
 9 boyfriend but that was more a front because back then being gay
 10 was not out like it is now. So, you couldn't be gay and think
 11 that you're going to be a gang member; or be gay and think that
 12 you're going to be around gang members.

13 So, when you see them now, be like, oh yeah, he gay,
 14 what's up; you know what I'm saying and keep going. So, when I
 15 say I had a boyfriend it was because we both was gay, and we
 16 both couldn't let our people know we was gay. So, we became
 17 boyfriend and girlfriend.

18 Q: Ah huh.

19 A: So, we both, you know what I'm saying, we both knew
 20 the truth.

21 Q: Yeah. Do you feel that your sexuality was somehow
 22 formed by the molestation and beyond and, you know, kind of took
 23 - you know, sex with men equated this trauma where you just
 24 didn't want to deal with men?

25 A: Yes, exactly. That's exactly what happened.

26 Q: Okay. Got it. So, once you got in prison, into a
 27 female prison, and you're surrounded by women, you started to

2 A: Thank God.

3 Q: But in your case, you did make a bad decision, but
 4 you also can't be judged by your worse day. You've been on this
 5 earth for 46 years, and 365 times 46 is thousands and thousands
 6 and thousands of days.

7 A: Yes, sir.

8 Q: And there was one day that really affected a huge
 9 chunk of your life, and I think that the one thing that I'm
 10 noticing throughout this interview is that you're not glorifying
 11 that day; you're actually feel extremely bad about what
 12 happened. You didn't feel that [interrupted].

13 A: I didn't think it's cruel; a lot of people might,
 14 you know, I'm not even going to lie, a lot of people when they
 15 knew I was coming out here, and they felt like, ooh, I hated
 16 being in prison, and people would say, oh you're my hero, you're
 17 my role model, or you're - I'm nobody to be a role model for.
 18 My focus now is trying to stop kids from making the same
 19 mistakes I made.

20 I'm a firm believer that it takes a village to raise a
 21 child. I'm going all the way back, you know what I'm saying,
 22 and I believe that it does take a village to raise a child.

23 I would not want to see nobody, not even the Latin King's
 24 kids; I don't want to see no child go through what I went
 25 through. I wouldn't care what gang they're in, you know what
 26 I'm saying. I'm not looking at the gangs now; I'm looking at
 27 the child; I'm looking at the fact that they got fathers who are

1 have relationships with women while in prison?

2 A: Yes. It was like heaven. [Laughs]. It was heaven
 3 [indiscernible], yes, it was.

4 Q: Okay, so now you're out and you're married, you have
 5 a family, you still have your stepfather who has changed his
 6 life around; you still have other family members and cousins
 7 [interrupted].

8 A: I have a cousin; my family has died throughout the
 9 years for being incarcerated. So, when I came home, I only had
 10 my stepfather, and my aunt, and my nieces and nephews and my
 11 sister. Like I said, my brother was just murdered, so he just
 12 passed away.

13 So, I don't have family like that, but I have a lot of
 14 support, I do, where I'm making it, I'm making it. It might be
 15 in scraps and I'm crawling, but I'm making it.

16 Q: Well, you did the time, and you have the right to
 17 tell this story at the end of the day. You've given up
 18 two-thirds of your life for a stupid decision that a teenager
 19 has made. We've all made stupid decisions as teenagers. Some
 20 more extreme than others.

21 A: Yeah.

22 Q: A lot of the decisions that we made could have
 23 escalated into these types of things had certain other things
 24 happened.

25 A: Yes, sir.

26 Q: I feel like I got lucky myself. I could have been
 27 in similar situations myself, but for whatever reason, it never

1 Maniacs, Kings, whatever, and the kids are the ones that are
 2 growing up watching that shit, bro.

3 And a bullet ain't got no name. So, before I lose another
 4 life and I could have prevented it, I can't do that. I took two
 5 lives, but I be damn if I'm not going to save a million.

6 Q: Yeah, it's an inspirational story to a certain
 7 regard of going through what you went through and actually
 8 realizing the mistakes that you made; and also sort of the
 9 bigger picture of this is what happens when you start dealing
 10 with guns. Usually, you have a very bad outcome. You know,
 11 we're coming off of, you know, I woke up this morning to take
 12 off [overlapping] being killed in a dice game.

13 A: I actually just got the picture of him, and I was
 14 just looking at it on the way up here, and I got it on my phone
 15 with him lying on the floor with blood everywhere. I'm actually
 16 looking at this body, and I'm looking at his friend hold his
 17 body, and I'm thinking in my head like, bro, I've been there.
 18 I've been there.

19 I've watched my friend die like that. I held him like
 20 that, and I could just imagine his best friend when he's
 21 thinking in his head like, he finna go on a rampage; because
 22 that's exactly what I did, you know what I'm saying. So, I
 23 actually was just looking at that right before I came in here.

24 And I was like, my condolences to the family, you know
 25 what I'm saying; to his family and I'm hoping his best friend
 26 just doesn't make the same mistake, you know what I'm saying. I
 27 know right now you can't talk to him because anger is a

 12 the future, unfortunately, as it was repeated many times in the
 13 past. Tempers flare, people don't want to take loses, they
 14 don't want to be embarrassed, they don't want to deal with the
 15 heart of losing somebody, and guns get drawn, and lives get
 16 lost; people go to prison; people die that day, and it's a
 17 horrible cycle that unfortunately continues.

18 A: It's a cycle that's going to always continue, but my
 19 thing now, if ya'll want to go out and kill yourselves, that's
 20 on ya'll. I'm trying to save them babies. I'm trying to save
 21 them babies. I really - I can't even keep saying it enough, I
 22 really want to save them babies, so, that's why I'm so
 23 determined to get this program started because I'm seeing these
 24 kids go the route that I went, and if don't nobody help them,
 25 then they will - and eventually you're going to be paying for
 26 them anyway because you're going to be paying taxes for the
 27 prisoners.


